

Joann Ewert is thankful for the doctor who was able to fix her eye, and that it has taken only 2 weeks instead of 4 to recover from the surgery.


Joann also had news about Judy Benner, who some may remember, as she formerly attended Modesto Church of the Brethren. Judy was in hospice care, and has since passed away.




