#### Testimonial for Small Groups

Last week was a banner week for the two men's groups that I attend and I just need to say something about them. The first group was the Tuesday Men's Group meeting at 7am at Perko's on McHenry on the first and third Tuesdays of the month. The topic which was brought by our leader for that meeting, Eddie Hernandez, was the article from the latest Messenger of the seven churches that were proposing to leave an existing Michigan district and to form a new one. I read the article and thought I had a feel for the information. Our interim pastor Michael, who is from that neck of the woods, was also in the group. I had made a comment about my perception of the article and Michael added that my perception was not really accurate. Michael went on to talk about the individuals involved and the nuances of district polity. I found the discussion very informative and it made the article even more real and relevant. It was a very good breakfast meeting.

The second men's group is lead by Steve Reddy on first and third Saturdays of the month. The subject of the meeting was a piece Steve had found regarding personal character. During the first half of the meeting we normally just spend time checking in and what we had been up to for the past couple of weeks. One of our members had been back east attending the memorial service for his brother who had just passed.

Pictures of the brother and his art work were shown around and discussed. As time in the discussion went on many of us started to identify with this brother and knew of folks in our own family who had similar characteristics. His brother was in the room. There were laughter and tears and great discussion. We did talk about character and characters. I came away from that morning session thinking,"WOW! What a start for the day."

For those who are involved in a small group, you know that not all meetings are 10's, but enough are close enough and those are the ones that keep us coming back. For those who are not involved in a small group but want to be, my advice is to find one or start one, that fits your needs and interest. Maybe it is a small group dealing with current events and the Christian church. Maybe it is a small group based from a theological publication. The Grace of Gratitude-Luke 17:11-19

Our scripture tells the story of Jesus healing ten lepers. Of the ten, only one returns to Jesus to express gratitude. Our message will consider why it's important to express gratitude and what are the best ways to do so.

## December 3 The 1st Sunday of Advent "Longing for Home" - Isaiah 64:1-9

Our Advent theme is "Home for the Holidays," except the concept is not about warm fuzzy feelings, but about the real struggle for people who long for a home, a spiritual home, and about how Jesus can fulfill that longing.

#### Advent Bible Studies

"For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." (Isaiah 9:6) This verse of scripture has been interpreted as a prophesy concerning Jesus. But do we think a lot about what those four titles mean and how Jesus fulfilled them? That's what an Advent Study that will be on Wednesday evenings and Sunday mornings during the upcoming Advent season. We will spend one session on each of the four titles, first on Wednesday evening at 5:00 and then repeated Sunday morning at 9:30. Participants can move back and forth between sessions and will be able to gain insights into these concepts even if unable to attend sessions for all four titles. The schedule is as follows:

#### Those Colored Dots

Just an update on the results of those colored dots used at the last Council Meeting. The colored dots were used to find the level of interest in two proposed projects currently before the congregation. The dots represented "interest only," not a vote nor for funding. We had approximately 50 people attend the Council Meeting. The presentation for a new and more powerful sanctuary projector got 25 colored dots or about 50% of the vote. The sound dampening panels in the sanctuary got six colored dots or a little over 10% of the vote. Nineteen or 40% of the dots were not used, for whatever reason.

We will be using colored dots again in the future to try measure the feelings or wishes of the congregation. We hope to do a better job next time with articles first in the Chimes explaining the issue or question on which we will be seeking input. Thanks to the congregation for your ideas, opinions and comments.

#### Youth Led Advent Project

Tis the season for giving and this year MCOB Youth and the Witness Commission are teaming up to make some teen dreams come true! We need you to help! We have chosen to contribute to Hutton House teens this year.

Hutton House is a local organization ran by Stanislaus County which houses troubled youth from ages 13 to 17. These children may be runaways, kicked out of their home or sent there by Child Protective Services. Whatever the case may be, they are in need. Hutton House is home to eight children at any time and on average 250 children stay there throughout the course of a year.

The Youth chose this service project because they can relate to their age group. They are themselves grateful for the lives they've been given and the support of this congregation. Now they have the chance to help raise funds for those in need.

How can you help, you may be asking? We are accepting monetary donations in the office until December 15th. We are also looking for some items: eight twin bed sets, board games, toothbrushes, toothpaste, hair straighteners and curling irons and sweat pants. These are current needs at Hutton House.
