#### What's Happening in Children's Church

Children's Church has been meeting after the Time with Children portion of our regular worship services for approximately one year. About fortyfive minutes is spent each week in serious study, discussion, and play. Study time has included many rich stories from the Old Testament. Some of the stories studied have been Noah and the flood, old Abraham and Sarah having a baby, Isaac and Rebekah's sons, Jacob and Esau, Joseph the interpreter of dreams, and Moses as a baby and then as an adult leading his people out of Egypt. There are many more stories still to come. These stories are part of our Christian heritage which is important for our children to hear and know. During the discussion time the children consider how the Bible stories might apply to their experiences in their lives today. Having time to learn the stories of the Bible is even more important today because our church no longer has traditional Sunday School for our children. While study is important, building relationships within the church community are important as well. Children do this best through play. Sometimes it is a game using words from the Bible story, other times it is more active play such as tag, hide and seek, red light green light, different forms of races, walking the labyrinth, or most recently just having a great time in the fallen leaves, making huge piles to jump in, throwing up leaf rain, or making leaf angels and being so grateful for God's many creations. #### Tips for Sharing Joys and Concerns

The period of our weekly worship services during which we publicly voice prayer requests and celebration is a special time for intentional prayers, upholding members of our congregation and beyond. The Worship Committee offers some reminders of how we can keep this precious time flowing with the rest of the service.

\*Raise your hand high so the mike runner can find you.

\*Hold the mike within an inch of your mouth for best projection. The mike will be on and, even if you can't hear yourself, the audio tech is regulating the volume.

Tapping the mike or asking if you can be heard is disruptive and unnecessary.

\*State your name and if you are requesting prayer for another, include that person's first name.

\*Think through what you will say beforehand. Keep it short and give the bare minimum of information so others will have a chance to share also.

\*\*Announcements of upcoming or reporting on previous events, requests for funds, etc., are items that should have been given to the pastor for highlighting before the worship service begins.

We think by following and modeling these points we can continue the prayerful atmosphere of this portion of our worship service. We request your cooperation.-The Worship Committee

#### Homeless Shelter Meals

Beginning Wednesday, November 15th our church will be responsible for providing and serving one hot meal a month to the folks at the 9th and D Street Shelter. Monique Sanders has chosen to head up this outreach and is the contact person to answer any questions, (209-996-3749). Sign up to either serve food or help clean up at the church following preparation or call the church office to reserve a spot. There is a clipboard on the kitchen counter for your first name and phone number. Servers will need to have eaten before they come

as they'll leave about 5:00pm to serve. Clean up crews can eat at regular Faith Bites times. Modesto Church of the Brethren was one of the first churches to provide meals at the Shelter and cooked each week for 50-75 folks at that time. Now we have



taken the responsibility of once a month and serve a hot dinner for 90-120 people. The numbers of servers and those needed to clean up have grown as well. Consider if you are able to give a couple of hours to this outreach ministry once or once a month. This is a satisfying way to share time with others who are giving valuable assistance and experience compassion and gratitude for yourself.
