Invitations to Worship

Advent Theme - Home for the Holidays December 10 - 2nd Sunday of Advent The Roadmap - Isaiah 40:1-11

When planing a road trip we usually take the time to plan our route and while computer mapping and GPS systems might show us the fastest way, a roadmap might present a more interesting or more adventurous course that creates a meaningful experience as opposed to a mundane commute. Our faith journey works this way as well.

December 17 - The 3rd Sunday of Advent Launching - Isaiah 61:1-4

Isaiah 61 shares an extremely encouraging word to the people who were returning from captivity to a Jerusalem that was badly in need of a rebuild. Jesus uses these words to launch his public ministry. Sometimes when faced with a daunting task the most difficult part is take the first step, God's encouragement.

*Clothing: small thru large sweat pants, pjs and hoodies, socks for males and females

*Hygiene: shampoo, conditioner, toothpaste and toothbrushes, curling irons and straightening

irons, feminine hygiene products, hair removal creme, lice treatment

*Furnishings: 5 radios, solid colored bedding sets (no red or blue), comforters for 9 twin beds, 9 pillows

*Entertainment: board games such as Candy Land, Pictionary, Life, Scramble, Uno cards, Dominos, Jinga, decks of cards, X-Box 360 NON VIOLENT games, recreation passes for movies, fast food or FunWorks

Report on 21st Interfaith Thanksgiving Celebration

With assistance from many of you, the Stanislaus County Interfaith Council (SCIC) held its 21st Thanksgiving Celebration at the downtown Redeemer Church on November 20th. This annual event is done to support Inter-faith Ministries of Greater Modesto, 120 Kerr Avenue. Cash donations this year totaled about \$1,450.00, in addition to the barrels of food items and clothing donated to restock the Interfaith Ministry's Emergency Food Pantry and Clothes Closet. The program featured presentations by 12 different faith groups, followed by refreshments for all. Many individuals from these varied faith groups expressed the sentiment that this year's event was the best one they had ever attended. Among the highlights were introductory music from the El Vista LDS (Mormon) Stake's choir and closing music by the Redeemer's praise band, a lovely duet from the Catholics, two songs from the Central Modesto Seventh Day Adventist Youth Choir, and stirring chants or songs from the Buddhists, Hindus and Sikhs. A final highlight near the end of the program was a highly positive, inclusive presentation entitled, Giving Thanks in Islam," in both Arabic and English, by the Islamic Center's Imam.

I'd like to take this opportunity to thank all of you who participated this year. Thanks to Stephen Reddy and the members of our choir for presenting a joint selection, "I Choose Love," along with choir members of the College Avenue Church. Thanks to Sue Messamer for coordinating the baking, provision, and plating of at least 18 dozen cookies from a large number of volunteer bakers in our congregation. And thanks to Evan Campbell and Cal Aukeman for assisting the Redeemer's staff with the parking duties, along with three of the Islamic Center's young men. And a special thanks to Jill in our office, who figured out how to print, fold and staple all 300 programs mechanically this year, saving us hours of time. Finally, another BIG thank-you to one and all who attended the event. I hope you enjoyed it as much as I did!

As an aside, the cookies provided by three faith groups were more than sufficient. In fact, some 200-300 of them were hand-carried by a group from the Redeemer Church to an orphanage in northern Mexico, while another 500 cookies were delivered to Inter-Faith Ministries on the morning of the day of their annual free turkey distribution. As the SCIC member in charge of snacks this year, I once again thank ALL of you cookie bakers out there: the plethora of those delicious treats allowed them to be tasted by grateful folks even beyond the borders of our own country!

And as a final aside, and perhaps due to the multiple hurricanes and the wild fires in northern California, Inter-faith Ministries is experiencing a cash shortfall as the year-end nears. If any of you are still feeling the need to give more after contributing to our youth project's Hutton House, you might consider spreading some of your generosity to Inter-faith Ministries.-Dan Galt, MCOB SCIC representative
