### Patriotism and Idolatry

A couple of months ago there was a lot of news and controversy regarding professional football players taking a knee during the national anthem before games. This raised a number of questions for me that I think should have been a part of the discussion, but seemingly were seldom, if ever, addressed. Here are some of those questions with my reflections from several months worth of consideration:

Is standing at attention for the national anthem patriotism or empty symbolism?

I come down on the side of empty symbolism, real patriotism means getting involved on some level to make your nation a better place. By that standard, kneeling for the anthem might have started to call attention to an issue, but at some point it too becomes empty symbolism.

Why do people, including our president, make a big deal about how disrespectful it is to kneel in protest, but never mention the concession stands that continue to sell their products during the playing of the anthem?

Maybe we value the dollar more than our nation.

Why is it that somewhere around 98 percent of the time we hear the national anthem is at sporting events?

I have no idea, I cannot logically connect sports and patriotism and sometimes wish the anthem wasn't always played at sporting events.

When does patriotism become idolatry?

This is of course the most important question and also the hardest one to answer. I think there is a very thin line separating the two and that there should be some allowance for differing understandings. But, when Jesus says that the greatest commandment is to love God with our whole being and to love our neighbors, there isn't much room for beliefs and practices that diminish others. When our nation's actions come at the expense of others, a patriot can choose who to stand with, a Christian cannot.

Jesus calls us to carry a cross and follow him. Crosses are heavy, probably too heavy to carry while carrying a flag.

#### Sermon Snippets

January 7 - Ecclesiastes 3:1-13 - For Everything There is a Season - A new year is an opportunity to take a step back and reflect on



where we are in life and where we are headed in the future. This is true for organizations, like a church, as well as individuals. Let us consider what season of life we're in and what that means for us as individuals as well as where God might be calling us for the future, especially in 2018.

January 14 - Luke 15:11-32 - Jesus' Short Stories: The Prodigal Sons - Jesus used short stories, usually called parables, as his primary teaching tools. We often learn these stories as children and never really consider the complexities of these stories. One example is that the story we'll look at this Sunday is usually referred to as the Prodigal Son, despite the fact that the story begins be saying "there was a man who had two sons." Are we missing something?

Bike and Build was founded in 2002 by Marc Bush. After leading a



cross-country Yale Habitat Bicycle Challenge, Marc was inspired to expand and improve their idea. The mission of B&B is "through service-oriented cycling trips, Bike & Build benefits affordable housing and empowers young adults for a lifetime of service and civic engagement."

For several years, Modesto Church of the Brethren has been hosting B&B riders for one or two nights while they spend a day in Modesto helping to build or remodel with Habitat for Humanity. Recently our Witness Commission has been contacted by B&B representatives to help recruit riders from the West Coast. Young adults between the ages of 18 through 26 at the start of the summer are eligible to apply. In 2018, you're eligible to ride if you were born between May 1, 1991 and May 1, 2000. If you know any eligible persons, encourage them to go to https://bikeandbuild.org/prospective-riders/apply/ to learn more.

It isn't necessary to be an expert bicycle rider to join B&B; training is built into the program. What is required is considerable fundraising. Eighty-two percent of the money raised goes to the affordable housing agencies that the riders help along their route and also helps fund the riders' expenses as they ride. Part of the riders' expenses buy each rider a new state-of-the art road bicycle, which they keep if they finish the ride. A Bike & Build cycling trip is a once-in-a-lifetime experience, but alumni of many of the trips remain active with B&B long after their ride. ~Luella Cole for Witness
