Transitions

As the Modesto Church of the Brethren moves to the next steps in securing new pastoral leadership I thought it would be a good idea to share what researchers have discovered as the makings of a "perfect pastor".

The Perfect Pastor preaches exactly 10 minutes. He condemns sin roundly, but never hurts anyone's feelings. He works from 8 a.m. until midnight, and is also the church janitor.

The Perfect Pastor makes \$40 a week, wears good clothes, drives a good car, buys good books, and donates \$30 a week to the church. He is 29 years old and has 40 years' worth of experience. Above all, he is handsome.

The Perfect Pastor has a burning desire to work with teenagers, and he spends most of his time with the senior citizens. He smiles all the time with a straight face because he has a sense of humor that keeps him seriously dedicated to his church. He makes 15 home visits a day and is always in his office to be handy when needed.

The Perfect Pastor always has time for church meetings and all of its committees, never missing the meeting of any church organization. And he is always busy evangelizing the unchurched.

The Perfect Pastor is always in the next town over!

I hope you've gotten the point that I'm trying to make; there is no such thing as a "perfect pastor". This means that a part of my job as interim pastor is to help prepare the congregation for a flawed pastor. (Some might suggest that I've done an excellent job of demonstrating what that looks like.)

Recently I've been involved in several conversations that indicate there is some diversity of opinion as to what are the most important gifts that the next pastor should bring. This is hardly surprising and I don't believe

this to be a serious problem, but one that people should be aware of.

I see a bright future for the Modesto COB, but that is dependent on selecting pastoral leadership that can cast a compelling vision and then inspire and empower the congregation to journey together into that mission. It's also dependent on the congregation being open to styles of pastoral leadership that differ from past experience, expectation and personal preferences.

A pastoral transition is both an anxious and exciting time for a congregation. I see part of my job to lower the anxiety and ramp up the excitement. Individual or small group conversations that can address specific concerns are my preferred way to do that. So I will be setting up a schedule of times and places where I'll be that people can drop in to discuss this, or any other issue, called the Pastor's Traveling Office. You can also feel free to drop in the office or contact me to make other arrangements.



February 18 - The Launch - Mark 1:9-15 - This Sunday is the start of our Lenten series, Exploring the Ministry of Jesus to Discover Our Own. One essential element to discovering our ministry is to examine the purpose for that ministry. Perhaps the clearest statement of Jesus' purpose is found in the opening chapter of Mark. What does this statement say about Jesus' ministry and about our own?



February 25 - Investing in a Start up -

Mark 8:27-38 - Alexander Mack, who was most prominent among the founders of the Church of the Brethren, encouraged those who might join him on the journey to; "Count well the cost." Ministry has a cost to it and while the payback almost always far exceeds the investment, we still need to be aware of what the price of ministry will be.

March 4 - Making a Break with the Past - John 2:13-22 - Traditions can great meaning to our ministry, but they can also become a roadblock toward moving forward to the new places God is calling us to in our ministry. Discerning what to keep and what to discard can be very challenging.

45 Years of Making Life Better

Forty-five years ago Dr. Bill Forney, a member of our church (now deceased) went to Pastor John Hunter describing Therapeutic Homes, an agency that was working with disturbed children, but that was failing financially and about to close. Because both men wanted to help children, they discussed the possibility of our Modesto Church of the Brethren taking over the project. With approval of our church board, a board of directors was set up for the agency which included several of our church members. Before long, the agency office was set up in the little house that was the annex of our old Sierra Drive church building. Soon the name was changed to Sierra Vista Children's Center. Then came the portable classroom in the small parking lot behind the church as well as a classroom in the building's basement and offices upstairs.

Sierra Vista continued to grow and expand, outgrowing our church building, but not outgrowing the interest and caring support of some of our church members. We can be very proud of this tiny agency that was an infant 45 years ago, but is now known as Sierra Vista Child and Family Services. It has 28 different programs in 12 locations, working with 19,000 children and families this past year. Sierra Vista now has about 300 employees and a \$17 million dollar budget and has earned top accreditations for agencies working with children and families needing behavioral help.

A few of the many programs are clinics; classes with qualified counselors for parents while their children can be cared for in day care; foster families; non-public kindergarten through eighth grade schools whose staff are all qualified to teach and help behavior problems; adults who work with children in public schools; group homes where children live with adult counselors; and many more. Remember the recent article in our *Chimes* about the many motorcycle club members riding their bikes to our church to bring Christmas toys to children living in two Sierra Vista group homes?

Why this long article about this agency? The Executive Director of Sierra Vista Child and Family Services, Judy Kindle, will be the speaker for our Senior Event on Thursday, March 15. Judy Kindle was one of the very first employees and has risen "in the ranks," taking over when John Hunter retired, to the stage enumerated above where she and an excellent staff are devoting their lives to make life better for children and families who are struggling. We hope to see you for lunch March 15, then to learn more about this amazing agency in our community, working hard to help many, many people of all ages develop more positive and productive lives.
