

In light of the most recent school shooting, one of the things I've heard stated as the problem is that we've taken God out of the schools. Maybe I'm wrong about this, but I think what they are mainly referring to is the 1962 Supreme Court ruling that stated that school or state sponsored prayer was a violation of the 1st amendment. The provision does not prevent students from saying a silent prayer, which I believe happens quite often when a teacher announces a pop quiz.

What I find interesting is that in the Gospels, Jesus' teachings about prayer would be consistent with this policy. For example in Matthew 6:5-6 Jesus teaches that we should not pray in public, but go into our room and close the door and pray. In various places throughout the Gospels, Jesus models this concept by going off by himself to pray.

I think this is one example of something that I believe is huge problem in our culture today, the creation of an American civil religion that claims Jesus as

its leader with a very limited concept of what Jesus taught and/or modeled in his life. In its most extreme form this civil religion allows people to cherry pick scripture to support almost anything. Scripture, Jesus and faith become instruments to justify greed, nationalism, racism and misogyny among other forms of hatred.

Unfortunately it seems to me that many people who disagree with the worst of these positions have simply abandoned scripture and choose to base their stance on other principles. While these principles are usually solid approaches, scripture, properly understood, provides the best foundation for a hopeful and meaningful life.

However, making sure we understand scripture properly is a lot of hard work. We need to read it, study it and wrestle with it and allow it to penetrate our lives. If only there was an organization that can assist us in that enormous task...maybe there already is one.

Sermon Snippets - Our Lenten Journey Continues: Exploring Jesus' Ministry to Help Us Find Our Own

March 4 - Making a Break with the Past -John 2:13-22 - Traditions can give great meaning to our ministry, but they can also become a roadblock toward moving forward to the new places God is calling us to in our ministry. Discerning what to keep and what to discard can be very challenging.

March 11 - Now What? - Ephesians 2:1-10 - The last verse of the passage we'll be using states that we were "created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." So what are those good works? How specific should we make this calling? How do we determine which good works that God has prepared for us as individuals and as a church? These are difficult questions to answer, but maybe it's not finding the answer that makes them important, but the strength we gain from wrestling with the question.

March 18 - The Way Up is Down - John 12:20-26 - Most times the ways of ministry lead us in a very different direction from the ways of the world. As we consider what our ministry is to look like, let us be aware of how radical this calling is, and answer the question, "Is it worth it?"
