What is Our Mission?

The following comes from a book I am presently reading entitled, To Alter your World: Partnering with God to Rebirth our Communities written by Michael Frost and Christina Rice:

> "The redemptive plan of God cannot be divorced from the fruitfulness of the church. As the world is redeemed, the church flourishes: and as the church flourishes, the world is redeemed. So, the church is both commissioned and equipped to repair the fabric of society, and to serve as envoys of love, dignity, commitment, communion and grace."

So, what's stopping us?

That's a very complex question and to give anything less than an equally complex answer would be unfair to the church and the community and to respond with an equally complex answer would require to many pages, but I would like to offer up two things for us to consider:

> 1. We need to constantly be asking ourselves this question: What is our mission? One of the best ways to answer that question is to consider

two other questions; what are the strengths and gifts that this church has to offer? And what are the needs of the community around us? We will find our mission at the intersection of those two things. The reason we need to constantly be asking the question is that both our strengths and the needs are in constant flux and need to be evaluated and reevaluated

2. I believe that one of the hardest hurdles for churches to clear is the need to let go of the past. Traditions, practices and programs that served the church well in the past may no longer provide benefit the church. Yet the prevailing attitude too often seems to be an attempt to recapture the past by maintaining rather than creating a new future. We need to consider the words of the book of Revelation where God says, "Behold I make all things new," and discern what new thing God is calling us to join in on.

During my time at Modesto we have had some excellent conversations on these topics and I hope that we can continue those conversations as long as I am here and even more so that some of those conversations will lead to a new and exciting future. ~Pastor Michael

Our Lenten Journey Continues: Exploring Jesus' Ministry to Help Us Find Our Own

March 18 - The Way Up is Down - John 12:20-26 - Most times the ways of ministry lead us in a very different direction from the ways of the world. As we consider what our ministry is to look like, let us be aware of how radical this calling is, and answer the question, "Is it worth it?"

March 25, Palm Sunday - The Line of No Return - Mark 11:1-11 - In the Lectionary, this Sunday is listed as Palm Sunday or Passion Sunday. We usually celebrate the Palms and Jesus "triumphant" entry into Jerusalem. But, there was another aspect to Jesus' entry, it was in a very real sense a point of no return, Jesus fate was sealed on this day, the cross awaited.

April 1, Easter Sunday - Terror and Amazement - Mark 16:1-8 - Almost all scholars agree that Mark was the first of the four Gospels to have been written and that the evidence is very strong that the original manuscript ended at verse 8. This means that Mark's Gospel includes no post resurrection appearances by Jesus. How would the story be different if Mark was the only Gospel we had? And more importantly how would that impact our faith?





Maundy Thursday-Love Feast March 29<sup>th</sup> @ 6:30 Humble Yourself in His Love

As we approach Easter Celebration we need to remember and prepare for our Brethren Love Feast. For those of you raised Brethren or have been a member of our church you are aware of the importance of the Love Feast. Love Feast is celebrated on Maundy (Holy) Thursday, the evening before Good Friday, leading up to Easter.

Our Love Feast will begin in the sanctuary with a brief introduction to center those in attendance as to the purpose of the evening. There is usually a general description of what will occur: Meditation, explanation of foot and hand washing, hymns to be sung followed by the actual washing (your feet or hands will be washed by a fellow member followed by you doing the same). This washing follows Jesus' example of humbling himself in service to his disciples. It is also a time for us to be mindful that we cleanse ourselves of sin through this ceremony, as we did at baptism, when we humble ourselves to this act and its meaning. Following the washing we will go to the Gathering Place for a simple meal of meat and broth and culminate the meal by serving one another communion. The Deacons will facilitate the evening,

We encourage all to attend and to join in all or any aspect of Love Feast that is comfortable for you or you may just watch in a prayerful manner. Those who have attended found the evening to be quite impactful in their religious and spiritual journeys.

#### Dan Galt's SCIC Ministry

As presented during MCOB worship Feb. 18, 2018 I was raised in the 1950's in a Baptist Church, like several others in this congregation. An unintended side effect of my childhood was religious inflexibility; in other words, religious intolerance.

This intolerance was brought home to me when the sermon our pastor gave in the early

fall of 1960, as Richard Nixon and John Kennedy were battling it out to be the next elected president, when he announced, "While I can't tell you how to vote, it would be a crime against Christianity if America elected a Catholic president."

It wasn't until later that I saw this for intolerance. At the time, my 13-year old mind probably responded, "right on," as my mother and all her relatives were staunch supports of "Tricky Dick" Nixon. Where, oh, where, was the Constitutional division between Church and State back then? But this sermon did set my young mind to wondering: if Catholics weren't a part of Christianity, what were they a part of?

Fast forward a couple of decades. My curiosity for the fate of the human soul led me to major in international agricultural development, then to spend two Peace Corps years in the Catholic country of Brazil, then to dedicate two decades of my work life overseas. Such work assignments included the Catholic countries of Honduras, Ecuador, Colombia, and Bolivia, the Muslim countries of Senegal, Pakistan, Indonesia, Jordan and Turkey, the Buddhist country of Thailand and the Hindu country of Nepal.

In 1992, Sabri Er, my designated language translator for the preparation of training materials in Turkey, and I sat together on a public bus discussing religion as we traveled East to Cappadocia. He enlightened me to the peacefulness of his interpretation of the Koran; he was blown away to learn a bit about the Church of the Brethren and Protestantism, neither of which he'd ever heard of before that day.

My reasons for continuing international agriculture work evolved, moving away from the concept that I functioned as a "minor missionary," working to help provide more food for the rural masses, giving them better

diets and more "leisure time" in which to accept Christianity as preached by local "major missionaries" to convert all heathens to Christianity. My own particular Christianity had evolved into one of seeing Heaven as a wide-open, flower-filled field, full of not just Christians from any one of the truly "enlightened denominations," to a heaven filled with all types of Christians, Buddhists, Muslims, Hindus and other good peoples of various faith groups.

In the fall of 2014, Pastor Russ would soon be leaving MCOB to become the Regional COB rep, and Pastor Erin would be shedding some of their joint ministerial duties. One obvious choice was for her to give up her seat on the Stanislaus County Interfaith Council, or SCIC. I leapt at the chance to be her replacement, and the rest is history.

As Trish and I prepare to leave Modesto, two groups are the most difficult to leave behind. The first is this congregation, filled with such wonderful people. A close second is the SCIC, a group I've come to love for their expansive hearts, acceptance of all other religious faith groups, and constant work to spread the message of religious tolerance to all of Stanislaus County. In the past two years, the SCIC has added an annual prayer supper to the traditional Thanksgiving Celebration, and we held a major in-service training on the inappropriateness of religious bullying in Modesto City Schools. Fortunately, Luella Cole, another person who fully supports religious tolerance, has made a commitment to continue the important place of this church on the SCIC by replacing me as our monthly representative to that council.
