By the time you receive this issue of the Chimes, I will be on my way to Cincinnati, Ohio, to represent this congregation at Annual Conference. I am excited to be able to sit at the round tables with members of other congregations as we hear 9 reports and deliberate over 7 matters of unfinished business and 4 items of new business that will be brought before the delegate body.

I have been a delegate before, but not since the conference began seating the delegates at round tables, deliberately assigning delegates from diverse congregations to sit together and deliberate the business from differing points of view. I expect that it will be an exercise in patience, and I pray that we will all discuss the business before us in good humor and try to discern the will of God for our denomination's future.

Among the items of business are a statement on a" Vision of Ecumenism for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century" which the delegate body will be asked to ratify. A committee appointed in 2013 has studied research, scripture and the history of the Church of the Brethren to affirm the history of our denomination in maintaining positive relations with other faith communities.

The delegate body will also hear a report of the Creation Care Study Committee, which will present scriptural support and research data regarding the use of fossil fuels, climate change, and their impact on human life. The report challenges every Church of the Brethren member to integrate understanding of the reality of climate change into daily life, and into the life of each congregation. The Office of Public Witness has called a group of volunteers called the Brethren Creation Care Network as a resource to the denomination in this effort.

Several items of unfinished business will remain unfinished or will not change denominational polity after the 2018 conference, including Annual Conference Agencies, Bylaws, and Denominational Leadership Gathering.

Greatest emphasis of the 2018 Annual Conference will be given to a recommendation from the Council of District Executives, that the Conference develop a Compelling Vision for how we as a denomination will continue the work of Jesus together. One full day's business session and part of a second will be dedicated to engaging the delegate body in developing such a vision. After the 2018 Conference, each district will be asked to hold a gathering to provide additional input for the development of a denominational vision statement. Annual Conference 2019 will be primarily dedicated to developing and adopting that vision statement.

Items of New Business include: First. "Brethren Values Investing": a terminology change from "Socially Responsible Investing", defining the types of companies that Brethren Benefit Trust will refuse to invest in--those that generate 10% or more of their gross annual income from abortion, alcohol, gambling, tobacco, pornography, defense and/or weapons manufacture, and those who violate the environment or human rights. Second, consideration of Brethren Benefit Trust Director nominations: a change from four nominees to two. Third, review of a statement of Vision for a Global Church of the Brethren. Fourth, Polity regarding election of a District Executive to the Pastoral Compensation and Benefits Advisory Committee.

I hope I will return from this year's Annual Conference with greater understanding of denominational business that I intend to share with the members of the congregation. Thank you for entrusting me with this responsibility. ~Luella Cole

#### Interim Ministry Update

Hopefully my service here has been helpful for the congregation in preparing for a new and exciting next phase in your history. I have several goals to this end that I will be focusing on in the final months that I serve in Modesto, they are:

- 1. Lay a foundation for a young adult ministry.
- 2. Help in the development of a ministry of advocacy.
- 3. Encourage the church to consider some form of involvement in church planting in the district.
- 4. Begin a conversation about new ways to organize and conduct the operations of the church.

My experience in Modesto has been extremely rewarding on a personal basis. Still, it has been difficult to be separated from my family as much as is required and this is the primary reason for my decision. I hope that I will be able to maintain a relationship with the church in the future.
