I recently had the good pleasure of representing the Pacific Southwest District at the New and Renew Conference at Bethany Theological Seminary. While the conference itself was informative, what I found to be most inspiring was the opportunity to speak with people involved in the ministry of church planting. One of those opportunities involved the sharing of a table at lunch time with Luz Roman, a woman who has sensed a call to move from the Boston area to Las Vegas to plant a Church of the Brethren congregation there, and her husband Orlando.

I must confess to a certain ambivalence toward ethnic church plants before this conference. While I certainly wasn't opposed to them, I personally was more interested in traditional churches with the hope that we could plant churches in our denomination that would become multi-ethnic in nature. The conference changed my viewpoint on that. While I still desire to see multi-ethnic Churches of the Brethren, I also now see how meaningful our ethnic congregations are to their members. (I also have come to see that they may actually provide the best opportunity to become the multi-ethnic congregations that I desire to see, but that's another story for another time.)

One of the reasons for this change is that I saw in Luz and other ethnic church planters a passion for persons who are dealing with difficult life situations and their ability to connect with them, an ability that I would never possess because of language or cultural differences. Luz's heart for the disadvantaged and Orlando's commitment to his wife's ministry are inspiring to say the least and I hope will become contagious in our district and denomination.

The Pacific Southwest District presently has two church planting projects that we are supporting: the Las Vegas project and one in Los Banos, led by Rigo and Margie Berumen. Both groups are Latino congregations, and both demonstrate an incredible passion for discipleship. At a minimum we at the Modesto COB can and should be in prayer for the ministry of these church plants, but I'd like to see us look for other ways to come along side these two groups and support their efforts. In the coming days and weeks, I will be looking for ways to enter into conversation as to what that might look like. In the meantime let me know if you have any thoughts concerning this opportunity. ~Pastor Michael

Following the message on those Sunday morning, we'll have a time of conversation to dig deeper into the topic and to consider the topics we'll look at in August.


