## From the Board Chair

The search for a new permanent pastor is taking longer than the Search Committee had hoped, and Interim Pastor Michael Fletcher has notified the Board that November 18 will be his last Sunday at MCOB. Therefore, at last night's meeting, the Board approved requesting the District Executive seek another Interim Pastor for this congregation, to serve into the new year.

Since Pastor Michael will be leaving in November, and with no immediate prospect of calling a permanent Pastor at this time, at last night's Board meeting, Stephen Reddy graciously offered to resume being our Minister of Music, beginning September 1. Stephen is offering to provide leadership and continuity to our music ministry through the Holidays and beyond.

With all these changes taking place and knowing that there may be some questions and concerns from the congregation, I have scheduled a meeting after church on August 26, to be available to answer questions.

You may have noticed that the church will soon have a new neighbor on Dan West Court. A new house is being built on the lot at the end of the court. For years, we have had several neighbors along Dan West Court, ever since Habitat for Humanity built five houses across the street from the church. (There is one more non-Habitat house toward the end of the court, and two more privately built houses at the intersection with Woodland Avenue, but that's another story.)

The owner of one of those Habitat houses is a member of our congregation, but I wonder if any of us know or have had any conversations with the residents of the other four (or five) houses? I wonder if any of us know anything about the families who live there? I admit that I don't.

For that matter, I wonder how many of us know any of the neighbors around the church property? We are insulated from most of our neighbors by the acreage between the church building and the surrounding homes. In addition to the six houses (soon to be seven) across Dan West Court, there are nine more properties that share fences with the church property. How many of those folks have we met? Speaking for myself, just one!

I wonder how the folks who live in those homes see us? Are we good neighbors to them? Are they good neighbors to us? How would we know?

For several months, the members of the church Board have been reading a book called To Alter Your World, which challenges us to think about where the church is located, what the needs of the neighborhood around the church are, and how the church can discern what kind of neighbors God is calling us to be, as members of the community. To learn the answers to these questions, we need to get to know our neighbors.

Some of us have begun to take steps in that direction. Just before Peace Week, Karleen and Felton Daniels attended a Woodland West event and took Peace Week flyers. Talking to some of the families who were at the event resulted in the Dueña family coming to Peace Week, and continuing to come to worship nearly every Sunday since. I've contacted the principal of Martone Elementary School, and I also went to the office and chatted with the secretaries. We have had a good relationship with Martone in the past and I'm hoping we can rekindle it in some way.

Another way to connect with the community around the church could be for members of the church, even those who don't live in the neighborhood, to attend Woodland West events.

Terhesa Gamboa came to the church through getting to know Leah, the outreach coordinator that the church employed for several years. Through their efforts, they organized the Woodland West community around events that take place several times a year. During the Vital Ministry Journey process, as part of fulfilling one of our VMJ goals, members of MCoB partnered with

Woodland West to organize a neighborhood forum, including a panel of community leaders who addressed some local concerns. Most of those who attended, said, "Let's do this again!" Let's do it!

Do you have any other ideas for connecting with our neighbors? The Witness Commission is working on this Vital Ministry Journey Goal! ~Luella

## July and August Sermon Series – What We're Talking About When We Talk About

## Young Adult Gathering


