Continuing the work of Jesus. Peacefully. Simply. Together.



As one of your delegates to Annual Conference this year, I sat at a round table with seven other delegates, most from Virginia and Pennsylvania, and engaged in conversation around a "Compelling Vision" for the Church of the Brethren.

In the introduction to the Compelling Vision process, Moderator Samuel Sarpiya and Moderator-Elect Donita Keister pointed out that for 40 years, the Church of the Brethren has been wandering in a wilderness of conflict, primarily over differing approaches to the interpretation of Scripture, and differing understandings about homosexuality. The two moderators noted that: "In this wilderness we have found many oases of vital ministry in areas such as disaster relief and international partnerships in mission with Brethren around the world. We have been a voice for peace and have worked for justice in places where others are hesitant to go." In spite of differences, Brethren have continued the work of Jesus. How much more could have been accomplished if the Brethren followed their motto of "continuing the work of Jesus peacefully, simply and together?

At the 2016 Annual Conference, the Council of District Executives was tasked with responding to an item of business relating to same-sex marriage. Their statement, presented to the 2017 Annual Conference, concluded: "To stay on the journey together, it is also crucial that the church discern the compelling vision that this body of Christ is called to pursue." Two teams representing denominational and district leadership have been called to guide the membership through a process of discerning, through a series of conversations, what we as a diverse denomination, are being called to do—together.

The Compelling Vision conversations began at the delegate tables at this year's Annual Conference. Non-delegates were also invited to participate in discussing and recording answers to a series of questions. All the written responses to these questions were collected and will be combined with the results of similar conversations throughout all Church of the Brethren districts and congregations. The process of discernment will culminate at the 2019 Annual Conference, at which all business sessions will be dedicated to reviewing the results of conversations throughout the denomination, and articulating a Compelling Vision for what God is calling the Church of the Brethren to do together. Following is the set of questions asked at Conference. ~Luella Cole

Compelling Vision Questions Asked at 2018 AC

- We have been called to work together to develop a compelling vision for the Church of the Brethren. At the heart of that vision is a desire to live as Christ's disciples. What compels you to follow Jesus?
- Yesterday, we began our conversation about following Jesus. With that conversation in mind, what are one or two values that you think we who are participating in this process share?
- You've heard your conversations yesterday and your conversation today. What are the themes you see emerging?
- Why is it important for God's people to have a vision?
- What can make a vision for the Church of the Brethren compelling?
- What about developing a compelling vision gives you hope?
- What question do you hope someone asks you during the compelling vision process?

We are in a period of time that some are calling post-Christian. What that means is that the culture around us no longer maintains a Christian ethic as a defining characteristic. Therefore, we can no longer assume that certain Christian doctrine will be understood and accepted simply because the church says so.

You need to sign up so we have enough pizza and if you're able, sign up to bring a Birthday Cake. You will find the sign up board in the narthex.


To add to the fun we are asking you to bring a baby photo for a game we are planning. See you August 8th at 6pm. HAPPY BIRTHDAY in advance.
