Do we think of ourselves as being "rich?" Are we generous with our money, time and stuff? Should we question what we can give or what we can get? What is God calling us to do?

The 2018 Annual Conference was my tenth, and this was the fourth time you've entrusted me with being your delegate. This conference was by far the least contentious of all I've attended, and my experience as a delegate was delightful rather than divisive.

This was my first experience of being a delegate seated at a round table with 6 or 7 other delegates, none of which were from Pacific Southwest District. The idea of assigning the delegates to sit around tables rather than in rows of chairs began in 2012. Always before, delegates from like-minded congregations and districts tended to group together in the rows of chairs, and form voting blocs. Controversial items of business would attract many to the microphones, and debate would become heated.

This year, even though there were a few items that drew dissent, few speakers came to the microphones, and there was only one expression of frustration with the process. I believe that having the opportunity to discuss items of business at the tables, with other delegates who might have different opinions, gives those who want to be heard a forum to express their opinions without going to the mike.

There were very few items of business this year, due to the focus on the Compelling Vision process. (More about that in a minute.) The delegate body deliberated on the Vision for a Global Church of the Brethren, accepting the recommendation of the Mission and Ministry Board that the global Church of the Brethren be a "union of autonomous bodies," bound together by a common theology and commitment to be in relationship."

The Vision for Ecumenism paper was passed, reaffirming the Church of the Brethren's historical service in disaster relief, missions, and peace witness, in cooperation with other faith traditions.

Perhaps the most contentious item of business was the paper on Creation Care. There were those who wanted to debate the reality of climate change rather than the actual provisions of the proposal. The aim of the paper, which was passed, was to encourage the use of renewable energy throughout the denomination, by creating a Creation Care Network of expert volunteers to facilitate that aim.

The 2018 delegate body accepted with little discussion the report of the Vitality and Viability Committee, in spite of some farreaching recommendations. Because the root concerns prompting the original query were related to the disagreements about human sexuality/same-sex marriage and the reality that some congregations may leave the Church of the Brethren due to deeply held beliefs about Biblical interpretation, perhaps the most significant portion of this report is the following: "...Vitality in this context means forming a process to ensure that congregations who may leave do so in an accountable, amicable, and gracious process. This means avoiding litigation and instead seeking to mutually bless rather than

forestall unnecessarily." The report also suggests "clarifying the changing scope and force of Annual Conference." What that would mean is not explained.

In addition, the report includes several examples of districts and congregations which have dealt creatively with changes in their midst, some of which relates to the Compelling Vision process.

Other items of business were related to minor changes in terminology and procedure. The delegate body approved a 2% increase in the salary scale for pastors.

The greatest part of two business sessions was devoted to beginning the Compelling Vision Process, which grew out of a 2017 unfinished business item entitled "The Authority of Annual Conference and Districts Regarding the Accountability of Ministers, Congregations and Districts". Referred for study to the Council of District Executives and the Leadership team, this item of business involved the disagreements about same-sex marriages and ordinations that have divided the Church of the Brethren for decades. Therefore, the leadership decided to try to change the conversation toward "the framing of a compelling vision for how we will continue the work of Jesus together."

Conversations about the Compelling Vision Process began at the 2018 conference and will continue through 2018 and 2019 with conversations in every district. Two groups will work to synthesize the themes that result from the denomination-wide conversations, and bring their findings to Annual Conference 2019. The business sessions of Annual Conference 2019 will be primarily devoted to the development of a Compelling Vision for the Church of the Brethren. You will be hearing more about Pacific Southwest District's part in this process. ~Luella Cole
