The recent proceedings around the confirmation of a Supreme Court Justice reminded us just how polarized our nation is. I believe this polarization is more of a political manipulation to gain and hold onto power than a legitimate division based on issues. Therefore, whenever there is a legitimate divide over an issue, rather than seek a solution to the problem, it becomes an opportunity for political gain. There may be no issue where this is more prevalent than abortion, which appears to be at the heart of the controversy concerning the recent Supreme Court debate.

Let me state that I am anti-abortion, I believe it to be inconsistent with the way of life that Jesus taught and modeled. Having said that, let me say two things that give more definition to my position on this topic.

One, I define myself as anti-abortion because I believe the pro-life and pro-choice labels are misapplied in the way they are normally used. To me being pro-life means that we're opposed to the death penalty, war and any other form of violence to achieve our goals. I also believe that being pro-life should mean being committed to a standard of living for all persons that includes things like nutrition, healthcare, housing and education.

We can debate what that standard is and how we achieve it, but we cannot accept the levels of poverty and homelessness that exist for children in this nation and the world and call ourselves pro-life. Nor can we accept the exploitation of the poor and the planet and call ourselves pro-life.

I could go into much greater detail on that point, but it's the second point that I really want to focus on. While I am antiabortion, I have no misconceptions that a political solution will have any significant impact on the problem. In fact, I think it may actually make things worse. Outlawing abortion means that women who are faced with an unwanted pregnancy essentially have two choices. One, give birth to an unwanted child. While it's true that adoption provides a partial solution to this issue, it's not a perfect solution for everyone. Any child brought into the world against its parents' will starts out at a huge disadvantage. The second option is to have an illegal abortion, which means a safe abortion for women of means and unsafe abortions for the poor. Hardly a just situation.

I believe that the solution is to create a society where there is no such thing as an unwanted pregnancy. A society where every baby born is loved and cherished, not only by that baby's family, but by the entirety of the society into which it is born. To achieve that goal, we need to create a society where no

family ever feels they can't afford another child, where no woman feels she needs be sexually active to gain acceptance and no man feels his importance enhanced by how many women he has sex with.

There are probably many other things that need to happen to create such a society, so many that it would be easy to simply excuse it as impossible and not even try. But Jesus calls us to be faithful, not successful, and so to be a follower of him means we are called to advance the kingdom of God here and now. This almost always occurs one small step at a time. So let's quit politicizing abortion and take a small step on the way. ~Pastor Michael
