Hooray! The Pastoral search is finally over! On March 31, 2019, Andrew Sampson accepted our call to full-time ministry, following an overwhelmingly positive vote during council meeting. However, as we bask in the glow of 'mission accomplished', let's remember that we're not 'there' yet, but still in transition while awaiting the Sampson family's arrival in June.

Looking back over the long search process, I'm thankful to all of you for keeping our congregation moving forward month after month. Your trust, encouraging words, patience and prayerful support enabled the Search Committee to take the time needed to discern the 'fit' for our unique faith community. Our choice to bring Andrew to meet the congregation was a unanimous decision.

During the search, we had gifted pastoral leadership from our Interim Pastors. Thanks goes to Interim Pastor Michael Fletcher for providing nearly 2 years of full-time pastoral leadership. After his departure, Stephen Reddy graciously stepped up to the plate, sharing his leadership gifts in both pastoral and music ministries. In addition to pastoral leadership, countless capable lay people continued to offer their time and talents during worship services, giving sermons or filling other roles (sound techs, worship leaders, story tellers, musicians, worship table and banner designers, greeters, ushers, money counters, candle lighters etc.).

Expressions of appreciation would not be complete without mentioning important ministries beyond worship. Throughout the search journey, many of you continued to graciously take on all the tasks necessary to keep our church functioning. Our faithful Church Board and Commissions, Deacons, Worship Committee and Children's & Youth leaders all provided ongoing support for ministries behind the scenes. During the "Meet and Greet Weekend", the Fellowship and Recreation Commission kept us well-fed, as usual.

David Shetler (District Executive from the S. Ohio District) provided crucial expertise and encouragement while 'shepherding' the Search Committee along the entirety of our journey. David's tenure with us is finished, and now Russ Matteson is 'back in the saddle' as DE for our congregation.

Finally, a special 'shout out' to our 7person Search Committee: Evan Campbell, Karen Cosner, Felton Daniels, Rachel Gilstrap-Katen, Matt Hazen, and David Messamer. Our wide-ranging perspectives, ages, and interests proved to be an asset while wrestling with the pros and cons of each applicant, one candidate at a time. Throughout the process, our respect for each other and commitment to common purpose enabled us to listen, find connection and work together courteously as a team. Although we're grateful to have been a part of the search process, we're pleased to close this chapter in the life of our congregation in anticipation of a brand new one! Trish and I would like to express our great gratitude to all of you who have expressed your concerns via calls, texts and cards, and have continued to pray, for my progress with radiation treatments against aggressive prostate cancer.

I began treatment on March 27th with internal radiation (one dose of brachytherapy) in Sacramento. This will be followed by 5 weeks of external radiation in Vacaville, beginning April 10 and ending May 15.

For this reason, I'd like to ask you to continue your prayers for my continued treatment and recovery. Trish and I still consider you all family, and many of you are included in our daily prayers. Thanks again for your concerns and wonderful prayers! ~Dan and Trish Galt

Hello and hugs from our little corner of the world, from Marley Brown Mueller. Thank you all for your recent thoughts and well wishes from around the globe.

It's certainly been an emotional couple of weeks as we still recoil in disbelief at the absolute sense of violation that we have endured. It has certainly touched us all on a personal level.

In my role as Triage Nurse I have spoken to more than one person who is connected to someone who knows someone who was either wounded or killed in this senseless act. When I can help, even in such a small way, I certainly pause to breathe and even manage a smile. I feel that New Zealand has certainly lost her feeling of calm remoteness, and an isolated sense of serenity.

In the last 2 weeks we do not open the National News to 'latest sightings of a pod of orca seen on our coastline' or the 'rural community groups raising money for other people in need of some assistance'. These latest events have sent our little country into a worldwide state of grief. We have seen firsthand the smaller community vigils/ prayers/ candles and unity of all people, races and religions holding tightly together.

Our Prime Minister, Jacinda Ardern, has received credit from around the world for her handling of this tragedy. The New York Times headlined 'Jacinda Adern, New Zealand's Prime Minister "leads by following no-one."

It also mentioned that she may have rewritten the script for how a nation grieves. As well as displaying this remarkable act of empathy, she humbly stated that "I don't think I'm displaying leadership. I just think I'm displaying humanity". She speaks for all New Zealanders. She has swiftly taken action, with her parliament, to ban military style semi-automatic weapons (and to top it off she has insisted that she herself will never name the killer).

Jacinda has certainly won the respect of the 1.5 billion Muslims from around the world. Her mark reached the Burj Khalifa building in Dubai that was lit up by her image hugging a Muslim woman in the wake of this tragedy. A petition was started in France that is now circulating, for her to receive a Nobel Peace Prize for the compassionate response that she has shown to all of this. So Thank You all for your emails, texts, WhatsApps, and messages. It's heartwarming to know that you are all holding hands with us. We can certainly feel the warmth.

25th Annual Martin Luther King, Jr. Commemoration--March 30, 2019 Legacy Award Honoring Gene Palsgrove and Mary Baucher



Gene Palsgrove and Mary Baucher have been involved with many community service efforts during their many years in Modesto. Gene, a World War II conscientious objector, Church of the Brethren minister, teacher and principal in the Modesto City Schools for 30 years, helped start the Community Rehabilitation Project in South Modesto. He was also instrumental in founding the Modesto Peace/Life Center in 1970 and the Martin Luther King Jr. Commemoration Committee in 1994, establishing Interfaith Ministries food bank and creating Modesto's Sister City program with Khmelnitskiy in Ukraine. Mary Baucher has always considered herself to be a behind the scenes community volunteer, wanting to help others. Mary helped found the Modesto Peace/Life Center and worked for many years with Friends Outside. She helped start a child care program at Sierra Conservation Center in Jamestown, became a facilitator for the Bereaved Parent Support Group under the auspices of Via, which merged with Community Hospice.

Mary was involved with Habitat for Humanity and West-Care Adult Day Care Center, and helped start Modesto's SERRV International Gift Shop. She has been involved with the Cooperative Disaster Child Care Program through the Church of the Brethren.

Gene and Mary, whose separate families were next-door neighbors for many years, were both previously married to spouses, Bob Baucher and Lenore Palsgrove, who themselves had a long history of community service.
