Teaching the Children...



On Palm Sunday, during Children's Church, Jim Martinez taught the children about footwashing and Love Feast. For the presentation Jim used a tub and basin along with an apron and towel for a footwashing demonstration. He also provided vials for grape juice and communion bread so the children could participate in an actual communion.

Jim let them know that the youth had made the communion bread and he wanted them to notice the shape of the holes made in the bread (a cross). He explained the symbolism of the bread representing the body of Christ and the juice, symbolic of Christ's blood.

Jim first discussed the Last Supper and how Jesus washed his disciples' feet to humble himself to his followers as an act of service. They talked about how they can serve one another and their family and friends and the importance of service. Marquis Thomas, a Junior High youth, helped Jim demonstrate the foot washing, as Jim explained how it is a service but also a way to humble yourself to the person whose feet you wash.

Although these were young children, the hope is that it helped imprint a special tradition that we Brethren practice and associate with the Easter Holiday.

At the actual Love Feast, Marquis demonstrated his understanding of the meaning of footwashing by volunteering to wash the feet of three members of the congregation who would have had difficulty getting down to wash their neighbor's feet!
