Letting Go

In the March issue of Messenger, Wendy McFadden's essay on "Letting Go" spoke to me, because for the last several months, I have been in the process of letting go of the many possessions that I have accumulated in the house I have called home for the past 26 years. Although I like my neighborhood, the house and yard are too much for Larry and me to keep up anymore, so we're planning to downsize—as soon as we pare down our possessions.

I'm trying to be unemotional as I pull out things I've carefully stored in closets, cabinets and garage, deciding which category to put each thing in: keep, donate, or toss. Having come from a long line of pack rats, this is not easy.

As Wendy McFadden says, excess possessions "weigh us down". I have allowed that to happen. Now that the garage has been liberated from much of the stuff that I let accumulate, I can get the car in without worrying about hitting something. It is freeing to be able to see the things I need to use! The more I let go, the more free I feel.

In her essay, Wendy enumerates several other things that we need to let go of: Acquiring more stuff, needing to be in control, resentment and complaints, fear of what might happen, and outrage. At various times I've held onto all these burdens and often struggled to let them go.

All of these, along with too much stuff, take the place of living simply, being open and generous to others, and living as Jesus taught. ~Luella
