The Iona Community

The Isle of Iona is a small island off the west coast of Scotland. The Iona Community was founded in 1938 by Rev. George MacLeod, to close the gap which he perceived between the church and working people. He took a group of ministers and unemployed skilled working men to Iona to rebuild the ruined medieval Iona Abbey together. The Iona Community has developed into a Christian ecumenical community working for peace and social justice, rebuilding of community and the renewal of worship. Their publishing group, Wild Goose Publications, has produced music and worship material from which came this hymn that we sang in worship on August 25.

Scriptures: Luke 14:1, 7-14
Title: "A New Way to Measure"

Theme: The ways that we measure success

are not necessarily God's!

Summary: Luke's text is more than about table manners in first century Palestine, and so this will not be a sermon from Miss Manners! However, it does seem like a lot of "if/then," actions happening. But as with most of Jesus' teachings it is not as simple as a black and white understanding. What it does is offer us the challenge of reconsidering how we measure success in our lives and as a church.

Scripture: Luke 14:25-33 Title: "Count Well the Cost"

Theme: To be a follower of Jesus requires

serious thought.

Summary: "Count well the cost," is a statement made by Alexander Mack, founder of the Church of the Brethren, and continues to be relevant today. In today's text Jesus delivers zinger after zinger which makes me wonder what the reactions of the "large crowd" were. However, the biggest zinger could be the last, that is found in verse 33. Consider what it has meant for you to follow Jesus, and what words of wisdom you might impart to those contemplating being a follower of Jesus.


