Who are we seeking to make company with - the in crowd or the fringe?

Scripture: Romans 12:17-18 (The Message) Title: "The Case for Peace" Theme: Celebrating Peace Day Summary: I think that The Message translates this passage in a way that is most understandable, "Don't hit back; discover beauty in everyone. If you've got it in you, get along with everybody." The impetus of these verses is our relationship with one another. What grabs my attention is how it is our responsibility, but not to the detriment of our own being. Or, a quote by Robert Jones, Jr. that I recently posted reads, "We can disagree and still love each other, unless your disagreement is rooted in my oppression and denial of my humanity and right to exist." Peace is not an activity of the weak!






Seniors to celebrate 25 Years with Senior Ministries
