Invitation to Worship

October 27

Scriptures: Joel 2:23-32 and Psalm 65 Title: "Anxious Moments"

Summary: A few years ago, I was at a church that had invited two Muslim women from Iraq to share about their wartime experiences. A part of their stories that has stuck with me was of the constant presence of drones, and how the drones' sound created such anxiety and distress. I mention this as our reading from Joel comes after the locusts had decimated the Israelites' crops and harvests for several years. And I wonder if the sound of the locust swarm produced the same type of anxiety among the Israelites as the drones did to the Iragi women who I heard speak. What about our own anxieties? We may not have locusts or drones, but many of us carry some anxiety every day. Joel and the psalmist's words are of encouragement, joy, and abundance as God remained with the people through their struggles. How can their words speak to our anxieties today?





November 3 Scripture: Luke 19:1-10 Title: "A Short Story"

Summary: "Zacchaeus was a wee, little man," is the beginning of a song that many of us probably learned in Sunday school when we were younger. But other than Zach being under tall, what do we know about him? Not a whole lot, although the historical record can help to provide some background info about tax collectors. We know that they were despised by the people because they worked on behalf of Rome, and that they were crooked, corrupt, and took advantage of the people. Not necessarily the kind of person that you want to be associated with, but Jesus did not care and went to stay with Zach anyway. What about us? Are we willing to put our reputation on the line and associate with "those people?"
