Quiz Question: Which Gospels tell of Jesus' birth?

We will celebrate Advent around the theme, "Kindle a Flame," as we prepare ourselves for Jesus' birth. During worship we will have special elements added to the worship services such as celebrating the 300th anniversary of, "Joy to the World," a popular Christmas song (that is not located in the Christmas section of our *Hymnal*). Additionally, the children will sing on December 15, the handbell choir will perform, those wishing to sing Christmas carols can come fifteen minutes early, and a whole host of other specials!

In addition, on **December 8**, the worship service will begin at **10:45** for the purpose of singing some ADVENT CAROLS! So, come early so we can sing some carols we don't often sing for worship.

The Jewish prophets spoke for centuries of how one day a Messiah would come, and for Christians we celebrate that person as Jesus.

COUNCIL INCREASES SUPPORT

The last Chimes had a well-written summary of our Council Meeting on November 17^{th} that included a brief statement about changes in the Witness Commission budget. In my opinion, those changes were significant and need more clarification and explanation.

The changes the Witness Commission made for our outreach giving was to provide better support for LGBTQ persons to be included in congregations throughout the Church of the Brethren. The changes included reducing our giving for the general work of the denomination, namely the Mission and Ministry Board, by \$4,000 a year and increasing our outreach commitment to On Earth Peace and the Supportive Community Network by \$2,000 each. Both of these organizations work to help LGBTQ persons become accepted as equals in Brethren Congregations. These changes were discussed with questions for clarity and were passed unanimously as a part of the budget recommended by the board.

The meaning behind these changes is that we are not only an Open and Affirming congregation but we are increasing our support for the work that needs to be done to help LGBTQ persons to be heard and be included in Brethren congregations throughout the denomination. I would propose that our next step would be to inform the Mission and Ministry Board and Annual Conference about the changes we have made and why we made them.

Only a few Brethren congregations are Open and Affirming. Denominational leadership is pushing hard for unity through the Compelling Vision program to the point of ignoring the fact that most of our churches are denying membership to 4.5% of the population (namely the LGBTQ community). I think unity is not as important as having all of our churches be welcoming to all people. In my opinion it is time the denomination faces that fact and deals with it directly.

In my mind, the changes the Witness Commission made in our budget were positive and significant in our congregation's support of the denomination as a whole and speak very clearly and faithfully to my understanding of Christ's message. ~Felton Daniels
