Lent Is Not Giving Up Stuff by <u>Jarrod McKenna</u>, from Sojourners Magazine, 02-18-2015

Rowan Williams reminds us:

"The word 'Lent' itself comes from the old English word for Spring. It's not about feeling gloomy for forty days. It's not about making yourself miserable for forty days. It's not even about giving things up for forty days. Lent is spring time. It's about preparing for that great climax of Spring time, Easter: new life bursting through death... self-denial isn't an end in itself but to sweep and clean the room of our own minds and hearts so that the New Life might really have room to come in and take over and transform us at Easter."

As many start Lent with ashes as the reminder of our mortality, let us ask ourselves, "what will we do with the gift of life we have been given?"

The Brethren Global Women's Project has an answer for this question: "The Lenten season begins on Wednesday, February 26th, and GWP invites you to participate with us in this inward and outward reflective journey.

Items of Note

MARCH18 A Special Lecture: "Divine Violence in the Christian Bible" with John Dominic Crossan By Pacific School of Religion This lecture is the opening session for the 35th anniversary of the Jesus Seminar, whose inaugural meeting was held at the Pacific School of Religion in 1985. John D. Crossan is the premier historical Jesus scholar in the world. He is Professor Emeritus of Religious Studies, DePaul University, Chicago. He has written twenty books on the historical Jesus in the last thirty years, four of which have become national religious bestsellers: The Historical Jesus (1991), Jesus: A Revolutionary Biography (1994), Who Killed Jesus? (1995), and The Birth of Christianity (1998). He is a former cochair of the Jesus Seminar, and a former chair of the Historical Jesus Section of the Society of Biblical Literature, an international scholarly association for biblical study based in the United States. Zaytuna College is located directly across from the PSR Campus at 2401 Le Conte Ave, Berkeley, CA 94709 A reception will follow in PSR's Badè Museum at 1798 Scenic Ave, Berkeley, CA 94709.

QUORUM COUNCIL MEETING

The Moderator and the Board have called a special Council meeting for Sunday, March 15th immediately following worship. The meeting will consider one item of business: Changing the requirement for a quorum at our Council meetings from fifty to thirty-five. We were not able to vote at the last Council meeting because we did not have a constitutionally valid quorum and there have been other times when we could not hold the meeting because not enough members were present for a quorum. We would like to lower the number to more closely represent the members that are attending.

AMENDMENT TO: <u>ARTICLE V.</u> <u>CONGREGATIONAL BUSINESS MEETING</u> (<u>COUNCIL</u>)

From the current article:

E. Quorum: Although it is desirable to have as many persons present as possible for the Council, a minimum of fifty, or ten percent of the membership, whichever is higher, shall be required in order to conduct business.

To the following:

E. Quorum: Although it is desirable to have as many persons present as possible for the Council, a minimum of <u>thirty-five</u>, or <u>twenty percent</u> of the membership, whichever is <u>lower</u>, shall be required in order to conduct business.

The wording and numbers that we used in the Amendment were on the advice of the legal counsel for the Pacific Southwest District. In order for this Amendment to pass we will have to have at least 50 members present to vote. So please put the date on your calendar and come to church on Sunday, March 15th.
