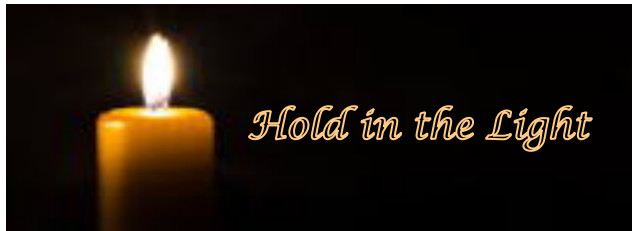

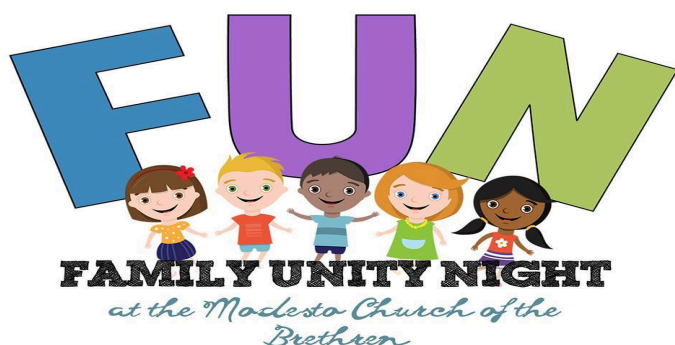


Calling Habitat Concert Singers

Glad and Generous Hearts is our chosen theme for the year. Webster says "glad" means pleased, happy, delighted. He defines "generous" as giving of time or money beyond the necessity or more than expected.

Family Unity Night (F.U.N) is coming up on Friday February 21, in the gathering place. F.U.N. is based on the teachings of Marilyn Price Mitchell PhD., and her program Roots of Action.
