To say that a lot has happened within our country and community over the past couple of weeks is a gross oversimplification! The murder of George Floyd in Minneapolis as well those of Ahmaud Arbery and Breonna Taylor have caused civil and social unrest in our world as well as in our thoughts, our actions, and our reactions. As I sit here and try to think about what to write, the words are not coming easily.

So, I want to begin by apologizing for the things that I have said which were insensitive and hurtful, actions that were inconsiderate and careless, and thoughts, that while private, were toxic, hurtful and mean-spirited. As well as the times when I could have spoken but remained silent, could have acted but did nothing instead, and implicitly became part of the system of oppression rather than an ally for justice. Perhaps the two most difficult words to speak in the English language are, "I'm sorry," but now is such a time when they are most required, so I humbly offer them to you today. I will try to do and be better.

But if you are as interested as I was in understanding the systems of injustice that exist and of which we all, to some degree, play a part, then I would encourage you to take a Harvard Implicit Association Test, https://implicit.harvard.edu/implicit/takeates t.html. There are multiple tests offered and I would urge you to take at least one. However, you should know that the results may make you uncomfortable, angry, and want to change the world! I am also available if you take one of these tests to talk about your feelings and reactions to what you have you gone through. Blessings to you all as we continue being a community that strives to follow Jesus in word and deed, seeking justice for the oppressed, and advocating for the needs of the neglected!


"What does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?"--Micah 6:8

Many across our country have protested in the wake of George Floyd's death because of the way authorities delayed arresting and charging the police officers involved, but most importantly because his killing is a perpetuation of the injustice, violence, and racism that have devalued and harmed Black Americans for centuries.

Many protests have remained peaceful; violence has erupted in some. What is clear is that the nation, and especially our sisters and brothers from various racial backgrounds are hurting and in mourning.

Jesus commanded in Matthew 3:8: "Bear fruit worthy of repentance." Bearing the fruit of repentance, we stand in solidarity with all who suffer from injustice, violence, and racism.






Camp Peaceful Pines News


