On Wednesday evening, June 24, I met with several representatives of the Church Board - Karen Cosner, Bill Johnson, Linda Hunter, and Marye Martinez as well as two healthcare professionals from the congregation - Jim Costello and Allison Sampson - to continue the conversation about the pandemic and assess its impact upon inperson worship. This is an ongoing conversation and we meet as needed to assess and reassess the situation in which we find ourselves.

We recognize that there is a feeling of urgency to resume in-person worship, and we balance this concern with the necessity of keeping the congregation healthy and safe. There has been a significant increase in the number of coronavirus cases within Stanislaus County to such a degree that we have been deemed a hotspot within the state.

Therefore, we feel that we are unable to set a date for when we could possibly resume in-person worship because the situation has gotten worse. We will <u>not</u> be returning to worship during the summer months, July and August, as there are too many unanswered questions in regard to the pandemic. The committee will work to keep abreast of developments during the upcoming months to inform the congregation on what is happening and how those events impact the church.

We will be distributing the state of California's revised guidelines to all commissions and committees to help keep the congregation healthy and safe as they contemplate small, in-person gatherings. What is BVS?

Through BVS, Brethren Volunteer
Service, people give their time and skills to
help a world in need. Volunteers work at
issues greater than themselves, recognizing
that their efforts may not immediately solve
deep-rooted problems. Yet everyone can be
part of the on-going work to advocate for
justice, work for peace, serve human need,
and care for creation.

As a ministry of the Church of the Brethren, BVS has been the hands and feet of Jesus by advocating justice, working for peace, serving human need, and caring for creation for more than 70 years. The horrific recent murders of Ahmaud Arbery, Breonna Taylor, George Floyd, and a long list of others before them, has brought further attention to the oppression of and violence towards our black brothers and sisters and demands that we continue to be Christ's hand and feet by advocating justice today. BVS stands firmly that Black lives matter and that racism is sin.

As a BVS community, how are we using our voices to advocate justice in this time?

We confess that we have been silent during times that marginalized communities have suffered and that our silence has made us complicit in giving power to white oppression. We repent of these sins and commit to increasing our listening, education, and dialogue about anti-racism.

While working to understand how we perpetuate systemic racism, we will purposefully create space to amplify black and brown voices during our orientations and in our office as a staff. Micah 6:8 says, "And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God." May it be so.


