I will be considered blessed by all generations.


- For the Mighty One has done great things for me; holy is God's name!

"During the 1970s, '80s, and '90s church folk made an annual hike from Yosemite's Tioga road out to North Dome. North Dome is directly across the Tenaya Creek canyon from Half Dome. The night before the big day folks stayed over at the Worthington (Jim and Margaret) and Weaver (Willie and Louise) cabin in Greeley Hill. Jim was a tree enthusiast and the drive always included a stopover to admire the Jordan Oak, a very old and massive live oak near Buck Meadows.

"Sylvan and I had previously tried to find the tree, unsuccessfully. We made another more diligent attempt last Friday, armed with directions off the web. "We were happy to find it, but sad to see that it has been dead for many years. Fires have burned the area but we suspect it had simply lived out its long life. Now its massive limbs are breaking off, and the debris is nourishing new little live oaks all around."
