
Use "hellos," bows, and other nontouch greetings

In the ceremony, the Executive Director, Curt Willems, acknowledged that Casa de Modesto was originated in 1965 by members of the Church of the Brethren. Casa de Modesto is a member of the Church of the Brethren Homes.

The new apartments have studio or one bedroom floor plans with kitchenettes and their own laundry facilities. The new apartments are smaller than the apartments in the Casa de Modesto's three-level buildings, but are also for active seniors who remain independent but no longer want the stress of home ownership and maintenance.
