The Church of the Brethren's Annual Conference was scheduled to be in Greensboro, North Carolina this year (as it moves around the U.S.) from June 30-July 4. However, due to the ongoing pandemic and Greensboro giving the option to the conference planners that there would be no financial penalty to cancel; it was decided to have a virtual conference.

This would prove to be a sizable challenge to organize, with 800 to 900+ delegates representing churches from across the country, who usually convene for business sessions in table groups of eight persons, plus countless folks who usually listen in on the business sessions. (Delegates are representatives of individual congregations. Each congregation gets one delegate for up to 200 members and additional delegates for each 100 members. Therefore, Modesto has two delegates as we have 201+ members.)

In addition to the business there are usually three blocks of workshops each day, at least one worship service per day, and numerous sponsored meals. (Delegates can easily spend 12+ hours every day in various activities at conference when attending in person!)

The question was what the virtual conference schedule would look like. The answer turned out to be nearly identical to the in-person schedule, despite the concern of many about computer fatigue, with business sessions in two-hour chunks twice a day, and being online 12+ hours each day if one participated in workshops, worship services, and special entertainment options.

The business sessions consisted of more discussion about the Compelling Vision, (<a href="www.brethren.org/ac/compelling-vision/">www.brethren.org/ac/compelling-vision/</a>) voting for candidates to fill positions, and ultimately deciding whether to accept the Compelling Vision (CV). The overwhelming amount of time was spent talking about the CV, which had been created and discussed for 3+ years and had cost an undisclosed amount of energy and money. So the delegates spent even more time talking about a document that almost everyone assumed would be affirmed.

I have reservations about the CV and questions that I never heard answered:

1. Roughly 3000 people provided input for the CV which equals about 3.3% of the denomination's official membership. In my opinion, that is entirely too low a percentage to try to accurately gauge what a group is thinking.

- 2. It is unknown-or at least was not disclosed-how many of the 3000 are still in the Church of the Brethren, since approximately 2100 people and 32 congregations left to join the Covenant Brethren Church, according to their Facebook page. How did this fundamentalist and ubertraditional group impact the CV? It's hard to know.
- 3. My delegate table at the 2019 conference asked repeatedly to engage with a representative of the CV team and was repeatedly ignored. Why? We never were told.
- 4. Lastly, the CV preaches a message of unity over inclusivity. Frequently, in the Church of the Brethren this seems to mean, "sit down and be quiet," to progressive individuals, churches, and organizations, so as not to "rock the boat."

The format of the CV ballot assured that it would pass, with three options for varying degrees of affirmation and only one dissenting option. Four hundred fifty delegates voted (out of a total of 519):

- 162 whole-heartedly affirmed
- 107 affirmed
- 100 had reservations but affirmed
- 81 cannot affirm (69 did not vote)

The CV passed but not with a lot of enthusiasm or energy except for maybe by the three elderly, white gentleman who presided over the conference. Next year's conference in Omaha will probably be in person and considerably busier at the business sessions since there was no new business at the virtual conference. I am curious to see what, if any, of the CV makes its way into conversations once conference finally comes out "West."


As well as socks, the Shower Shuttle needs men's boxers, sizes Small, Medium, and Large. (NO brief-style tighty-whitey's) please!
