Serving Our Neighbors in Times of Change

This Bible verse is the end of a longer passage in which Jesus is telling His disciples to go out and serve others! That is exactly what the Future Church team is brainstorming and proposing as the Modesto Church of the Brethren explores what it means to know our neighbors and serve our community as "the future church".

Many on the Future Church team will be reading and discussing The Art of Neighboring by Jay Pathak and Dave Runyon. The book study began on August 8, but all are invited to join for the remainder of the discussion times: August 22, 29 and September 12 at 9:30 am in The Gathering Place at church.



A BIG IDEA that is beginning to form is a monthly "Service Sunday". In concept, on one Sunday a month, various service projects would be available for church members, friends and families to sign-up and join. Instead of getting dressed for church, we would dress for service. One group's service project would be to prepare a simple lunch for everyone. When the groups finish their work after a few hours, they would return to the church for lunch and a group sharing, gathering and worship time.

Many, many details still need to be fleshed out, but I am excited about a new way to do and be the church while serving our community as the Church of the Brethren.

Our deacon body is reminding us of a special book in our church library. It's a binder/notebook with pages about those of our church family who have passed on and have been cremated and where the ashes might have been scattered or buried; or one who might have donated his/her body to science after which the body is taken care of by the organization who benefitted from the remains. This means there is no tombstone or marker at some place to acknowledge the life of that person. So remembrances can be placed in the lovely and interesting notebook/binder with the name Remembering and a beautiful picture on the cover.

If you have had, or will have in the future, a church member or active participant who fits the description above, please know you are encouraged to make an addition about your special person to the Remembering book which is now in the church library, on top of the shelf which backs up to the kitchen wall.

The requirement is to put on an 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ by 11 inch paper of your choice, information about your special person, and one or more pictures. The page can be simple and short or longer, with as much information as you wish.

Please put your page into the plastic sheet holder found behind the orange tab at the back of the book, and insert it into the Remembering book in order of date of death.

If you have any questions ask Mary Baucher, Pat Royer, or Marye Martinez. You will find the Remembering book in the library on a beautiful holder handcrafted by Wayne Davis. Feel free to look and get ideas from the pages there, or just peruse the pages to remember those of our church family who have moved on. But please leave the book in the library.
