Minute of Silence/Moment of Peace: "The Peace Wave" ~ Noon in all time zones 21 September



The PeaceWave began on the first observation of the UN International Day of Peace: 21 September, 1982, and has continued to spread throughout the world in multiple ways. The PeaceWave is for Humanity to use as a unitive act of Peace on Peace Day and every day.

PEACE BE STILL...

"Peace, be still and know that I am God" are lyrics to a familiar song we sing in worship and are also included on our new labyrinth sign. Our congregation has always had a focus on 'peace'.

Consider our Church's denominational tagline, "Continue the work of Jesus SIMPLY,

PEACEFULLY and TOGETHER". On Tuesday, September 21, the International Day of Peace, we have a golden opportunity to focus on peace.

Here's a couple simple suggestions for ways to commemorate this Sept. 21st Day of Peace:

- 12:00 pm A 'Minute of Silence' PEACE WAVE around the world at NOON in each time zone at our Peace Pole (by the COB front entry) or during your lunch break at work or home OR ⇒

- 6:30 pm Meet at the labyrinth for a Walk
- -Engage someone in conversation to listen for common ground within differing viewpoints.

This special day is devoted to strengthening the ideals of peace, both within and among all nations and peoples. At a time when war and violence often monopolize our news cycles, the International Day of Peace is an inspiring reminder of what we can do individually and together. Let's each do a little something to find peace within, in our community and beyond.

On the third Sunday of each month we will be volunteering at one of multiple projects from 9:00-10:30 then returning to the church for worship and lunch. There will be various projects for various ages and various ability levels.
