Allison asks for continued prayers for healing for her dad.


Rita expresses joy about the ice cream feast with Emily and Lynda Sesser last Thursday...They hadn't been together for 2 years




Lawn "Conversion"

No, this isn't evangelism to the grasses. It is converting water-guzzling lawns into landscapes that need no water (or hardly any). It is a way of conserving a scarce resource in California.

The city of Modesto encourages the conversion of lawns to save water and gives a subsidy of \$2 per square foot to help cover the cost of materials. Derek has spent most days for the last 4 months doing "lawn conversion" of over 1500 square feet, and has finally finished. The photo is of about 1/3th of the area converted. The lawn is artificial, the "golden" part is decomposed granite and the plants in the rocks are all on a drip system and are drought tolerant, so they need very little water. ~Derek Castle

Board of Administration Minutes September 13, 2021

Present: Andrew Sampson, Kim Boardman, Jim Boardman, Jim Martinez, Marye Martinez, Felton Daniels, Karleen Daniels, Bill Johnson, Elaine Forcier, Edie Ransom, Linda Hunter, Luella Cole, and Leslie Wilkinson.

Absent: Peggy Hoover

Opening devotions, Elaine Forcier: Desiderata of Happiness by Max Ehrmann.

- 1. Approval of Agenda M/S/P Karleen Daniels/Jim Boardman
- 2. Approval of August 9, 2021, minutes M/S/P Jim Martinez/Marye Martinez
- 3. Treasurer's report for August, Edie Total cash receipts for August were \$19,981.00. Cash disbursements were \$20,433.23. This left a cash decrease of \$452.23. The decrease for the year is \$3,258.84. Question: How do we clarify the use of vouchers with the church credit card? Answer: Each invoice and credit card charge must be approved; this must be done by the chair of the commission associated with the charge. M/S/P Bill Johnson, Elaine Forcier.

#### 4. Business:

- A. September 19th council meeting / Constitution discussion Kim Boardman: Do we want to rescind the Constitution draft, or, continue with the draft and go forward with the council meeting? Discussion: A motion was made to cancel the council meeting and return the Constitution revision back to the Constitution Committee. M/S/P Felton Daniels/Marye Martinez. An all-church email will be sent out to notify church members of the cancelled council meeting.
- B. Commissions and Deacons edit/clarify job descriptions— Kim: Job descriptions for commissions and deacons need to be updated periodically. Commissioners and deacons need to look at job descriptions in the current Constitution and identify needed corrections. Corrections should be made by December's board meeting. Job descriptions should be kept as generalized statements; lists of tasks, and other specifics, can be included in an appendix later.
- C. 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration committee appointment Kim: Our congregation will be 100 years old on November 9<sup>th</sup>, 2022. It is suggested that a celebration to honor this milestone be held the weekend before the 2022 District Conference. A committee should be appointed to plan the event, after the nominating committee has filled open positions.

#### 5. Reports:

- A. Witness, Luella Cole: No report.
- B. Personnel, Bill Johnson:
  - Evaluations have been sent out to the evaluators and these have been returned.

- Jill will be out of the office for several days, and volunteers have agreed to answer phones in her absence.
- C. Stewardship, Jim Martinez:
  - Discussed CD bank investment. Linda Hunter has withdrawn the money and deposited it into the church's bank account. Alternative investments are being explored.
  - Tithing cards have been mailed out to the membership, and next Sunday Jim Martinez will make a presentation about them during the church service. The following Sunday, tithing cards will be collected. Based on the giving, the commission will develop a budget.
  - Biggest concern: Everyone serving on the stewardship commission is due to go off the commission next year, except for one. Please let Jim know if there are any suggestions for future members.
- D. Worship and Spiritual Life, Elaine Forcier:
  - Positive feedback about worship has been received.
  - The internet service for the church has been upgraded, which has solved many projection issues during worship.
  - Regarding technology: suggestions have been made for a new IT person; screen projector estimates are being pursued.
  - There will be a labyrinth walk on Tuesday, September 21, the International Day of Peace
- E. Member-at-Large, Felton Daniels: No report.
- F. Christian Education, Karleen Daniels:
  - Youth: senior high youth have programs planned through December; program for junior high youth is to be determined.
  - A "Trunk or Treat" event is being planned for the neighborhood. During this time, our youth will host a haunted house.
- G. Fellowship and Recreation, Peggy Hoover: In Peggy's absence, Kim shared that events have been planned and scheduled; more information will be coming.
- H. Buildings and Grounds, Jim Boardman:
  - The church is experiencing hot water issues. Hot water is being delivered to fixtures where it should not be. This may be caused by a crossover between hot and cold water supplies, or there may be an electrical malfunction at the pump.
  - Water sprinkler times have been reduced. Our new water station timer should be easier to program.
  - The dumpster will be relocated.
  - The rent for the Peace/Life Center's radio room has been finalized.
  - Work day October 16th.
- I. Moderator, Linda Hunter:
  - No council meeting in September.
  - By October 15, all commissions should have their proposed budgets submitted to Stewardship.
- J. Pastor, Andrew Sampson:
  - Andrew will be leading a bible study for PSW Conference, focusing on Acts 2 of the *Bible*.

- Sabbath days are Fridays, not Tuesdays.
- NYC will be held in the summer of 2022. Work is being done to ensure safe spaces are provided for both progressive and conservative youth and advisors. Enrollment decreased dramatically at the last conference. This issue will be addressed.
- Visitation has been difficult due to the constraints of COVID. Hospitals have limited visitation with only emergency cases allowing visitors. Phone calls have been made in lieu of visitations.
- Facebook, the church website, and YouTube will have the stewardship video. Thank you to Chuck Messamer for doing the drone footage.

#### K. Future Church Update, Felton Daniels:

- Service Sunday. Members have met three times to develop plans. The goal is to try to keep things simple to start with, then, add more projects at a later time.
- There will be two to three events planned for the first Sunday. One event will be to either walk along Carpenter Road, and/or to Martone School, to pick up trash. Letter writing, and cooking a meal for the 9<sup>th</sup> and D Street Shelter, are other possible projects.
- The third Sunday of every month will be Service Sunday, beginning on October 17<sup>th</sup>. Projects will begin at 9:00 AM and go until 10:30 AM. A mini worship service will be held from 11:00-11:30, followed by lunch.
- A possible slogan for Service Sunday is, "Serve is the word on the third." Derek Castle and Annaliese Akpovi will serve as our co-coordinators. Central Catholic High School will include our church's Service Sunday as one of their service projects.
- L. Book study Jim Martinez: *The Art of Neighboring*, by Jay Pathak. Questions to consider: What is our church's vision? How do we want to present ourselves to our neighbors? How can we enrich our church? How do we communicate the answers to these questions to our congregation, in person/online? If church members have any ideas, please share them with Kim Boardman or Jim Martinez.

#### M. Deacons, Marye Martinez:

- Deacons will be meeting on October 31<sup>st</sup>.
- Deacons will be contacting people who have not been attending church service or events.
- Steve Reddy has been a music deacon by singing to a number of homebound congregants.

#### 6. Other:

- A. PSWD delegate registration/housing has opened. Delegates are Andrew, Marin McCourt, Rachel Gilstrap-Katen, Monique Sanders, and Kim Boardman. Conference will be held in person and online.
- B. Year-end council meeting date is Nov. 7, 2021, following worship.
